Dear Member,

The Gardens have again experienced very hot weather over the summer period, with a day in early December reaching 38° C and 105mm of rain with 42mm falling on the 14 December. In January two days over 42° C, with only 11.2mm of rain, and in February there were five days over 35° C, and just 18mm of rain. The first three days of March were all over 36° C and saw major fires breaking out in Gippsland. Until 14 March there has only been 3.8mm of rain and unfortunately predictions for the next 3 months is well below average rainfall. Despite these challenges the Gardens are in excellent condition thanks to the work by Council staff.

Council has painted the original 1888 fountain base and undertaken new bed planting and continued the weed removal program. Many of the beds were recently mulched.

Sunken Oval Works:

During March Council will be undertaking turf improvement works in Victoria Gardens. The works will include; Application and levelling of turf sand throughout the sunken oval, application of seed and fertiliser, installation of grow-mat to enhance seed germination and daytime irrigation to maximise seed germination.
