Victoria Gardens, like many of Melbourne's parks and gardens are now looking outstanding, and very green. The rainfall in October was well above average, and November has continued to be wet with almost 100mm falling in the past 3 weeks. The trees have responded well to this wetter and cooler period. An interesting "tree" was planted in September in the Lumley Playground to replace the removed Box Elder (*Acer negundo*). It's a *Dracaena draco*, Dragon's Blood Tree, an endemic plant from the Canary Islands. A specimen of this tree at Icod de Los Vinos on Tenerife, is reputed to be more that 1000 years old. Some of you may remember a large plant in High Street, opposite Airlie Ave. This giant succulent has a low wide spreading crown and mature plants can be seen at Rippon Lea, & Royal Botanic Gardens. Victoria's largest example is in the Koroit Botanic Gardens.
